My subject matter is what I draw from life and my techniques are threadpainting, applique, patchwork, quilting and embellishing with decorative machine stitching. What is Threadpainting? Threadpainting is a method for creating original embroidery by machine. The feed teeth on the sewing machine are dropped or covered so that the fabric under the machine's needle can be moved in any direction to create lines, areas of color, and texture by stitches.
