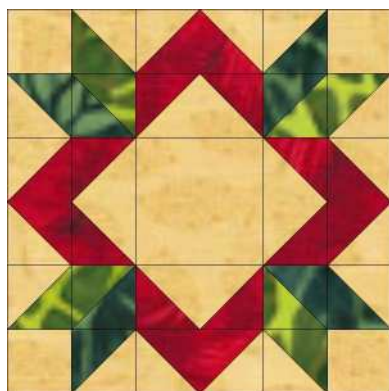






Block of the Month for December 2011




Laurel Wreath

Cutting:

Background: One $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square, one $5\frac{3}{16}$ " square cut in half twice ,
Twelve $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares cut in half once  and four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

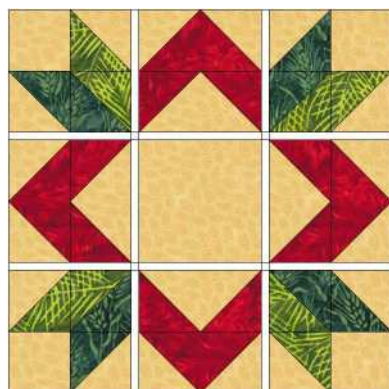
Red: one $5\frac{3}{16}$ " square cut in half twice , and
four $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares cut in half once .

Light Green: four $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares cut in half once .

Dark Green: four $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares cut in half once .

Sewing:

Lay out all of the well ironed pieces that will be needed for the block.



Work in sections to create the 9 parts,
sew together as pictured.

HINT: Flying geese and star point sections can be done by the Eleanor Burns Quilt in a day method which makes perfect FG and SP from just two squares. There is very little waste using this method. WWW.quiltinaday.com Look under Television for the online flying geese ruler demonstration for instructions. To get 4 - 2 X 4 flying geese cut one $5\frac{1}{2}$ " red and one 7" background square, to get 4 - 2 X 4 star points cut one $5\frac{1}{2}$ " background square and one 7" red square.
